

Title: Rendezvous of Friends



Title: Who killed Pasolini?



"Who killed Pasolini?" is a large wall installation (300x280 cm) composed of 12 boards (100x70 cm each) with pages from the book "Ragazzi di vita" by Pasolini, ink, acrylic and watercolour. The invitation addressed to the artist was a stance on space, a research on the optical involvement of the spectator thanks to a simple but complex language in its repetitive totality. "Who killed Pasolini?" is a work that aims to give a new boost to the memory of one of the most mysterious stories in recent Italian history. The large portrait of Pasolini naked on a boat in front of the Vittorio Emanuele II bridge in Rome communicates to us a sense of fragility and strength, the two souls of the well-known poet and director, broken by red color bombs that remind us of his sad passing. Pier Paolo Pasolini was murdered on the night of November 1-2, 1975. The death of the acclaimed Italian film director, poet, journalist and intellectual has been shrouded in mystery for over 40 years. Enrico Mattei – curator Vehicle Projects, Pietrasanta, Tuscany



"In this widely publicized life-size work in 14 parts, Rinaldo Hopf brings wit and stunning esthetic eroticism to describe on a spectacular scale the predicament of social relations in a pandemic. Seven athletic and well-endowed young men practice self-fellatio in different poses to comply with regulations on distancing. The artist also respected the required 1.5-meter distance between the protagonists. The background reproducing current newspapers from different countries around the world stresses the global scale of the phenomenon. This is further evidenced by the appealing diversity of the men pleasuring themselves, a reminder of the joys of cosmopolitan life now under strain."













Title: Pretty pretty Boy **Year**: 2023






